

Egyptian Animals Scratch Art & Monochromatic Painting



Objectives:

T.S.W. – Explore a variety of Egyptian animals and their significance to the culture of Egypt.

T.S.W. – Demonstrate understanding of monochromatic painting techniques (creating tints and shades of a hue).

T.S.W. – Demonstrate understanding of scratch art techniques.

T.S.W. – Self assess and critique their own work as well as the work of others demonstrating knowledge of DESCRIPTION, ANALYSIS, and JUDGMENT.

Procedures:

1. Explore animals on Symbaloo. Choose one to create.
2. Create a rough draft animal sketch. Practice creating patterns inside if time permits.
3. Create outline of animal on scratch art paper then add patterns.
4. Cut out animal.
5. Paste cut out animal on tag board.
6. Create **monochromatic** pattern using basic painting techniques around the animal.
 - a. When creating a **tint**, start with white and add small amounts of desired color.
 - b. When creating a **shade**, start with the color and add small amounts of black to achieve desired color.

Grading Criteria:

Monochromatic color scheme must be accurately represented.

Animal must be significant to Egyptian culture.
